Mmm....Cookies

One of the most popular treats in the world is the humble cookie. They have apparently been around since their origin in Persia, 7 AD and are considered to be one of the first foods ever baked. Many of us have fond memories of the smell and taste of a stillwarm-from-the-oven goodie, and mine is from my mother's kitchen, right around this time of year with something she called sandwich biscuits: thin vanilla layers made with a fancy press with chocolate buttercream in the middle.

Cookies are both treats and tradition, representing a cozy moment for "me time" with a tea or coffee, but also packed up and shareable like the Laddo and Peda sweets that were recently dropped off on our doorstep by our neighbours who celebrate Diwali. Cookies are cross cultural. From German Pfeffernusse time. When cool, sandwich together with vanilla, to Quarabiya in the Arab world, a version of them nestle in jars in every part of our world. They represent fun, a tiny bit of indulgence, and comfort, especially when our season turns to winter.

This is a modified version of my mum's cookie.

Sandwich Biscuits

1/2 c butter 3/4 c sugar powdered sugar 1 egg 1 tsp vanilla 1 c flour ½ tsp salt



Cream together first 3 ingredients, mix in the flour and chill for 4 hours or overnight. Roll out and cut into rectangles and bake at 350 for about 10 minutes. If you want a crispier cookie, bake at 375 for less peppermint, or chocolate icing and store in a reused ice cream pail, like all prairie people of my mum's generation seem to do. -Heather K (MAL)
