
Brevoort Park Newsletter Spring 2023

There are no pucks or sticks allowed on the main rink during these hours.

Rink Rules:

- Use the facility at your own risk.
- Prevent injury by using protective equipment.
- Do not bring breakable containers on the ice.
- Do not leave shovels or scrapers on the ice.
- Share the ice surface and nets. They are intended for everyone's enjoyment!

NOTE: Failure to follow the above guidelines may result in your being asked to leave.

Ward 6 City Councillor Update

This is such a wonderful time of year, as we get ready for spring. Huge thanks to your community association volunteers for all they do all year long to provide affordable activities and events in beautiful Brevoort Park.

Construction season is also about to get underway and there are significant infrastructure improvements coming to Ward 6. For more information, go to www.saskatoon.ca/construction. If your street is on the list, you can also sign up for e-updates. I have been encouraged by the progress being made and will continue to advocate for best standards in maintaining our roads, sidewalks and underground infrastructure.

There has been a lot of talk about the potential for a One final note, I hope you will join me for a Ward 6 Downtown Event and Entertainment District. For whatever the reasons for or against this project, I appreciate the opportunity to highlight some key facts. For every metre of sidewalk, road and underground pipe added to the network, Saskatoon becomes a more expensive city. To reduce this, Saskatoon's Official Community Plan calls for 50% infill and 50% greenfield development, and Downtown is by far the best opportunity to achieve this. Infill growth downtown maximizes efficiencies, where infrastructure and services already exist. After many years of research, studying examples in other cities and working with international experts and local stakeholders/residents, here are some key highlights:

Council is seeking a funding plan with NO impact to property tax.

Sasktel Centre and TCU are losing business due to size and technical constraints. Public amenities attract private investment. (residential & commercial)

Saskatoon has an opportunity to create a district to

support a more sustainable city – economically and environmentally - revitalizing our downtown and reducing the overall costs of growth. It also has a chance to bring more visitors to our city, adding jobs and strengthening the local economy. All of this said, there are key pieces of information needed to know whether this is a good decision for our city - including the full funding plan. For more information: www.saskatoon.ca/downtown

A few other notes, a fully re-vamped public and farmers market will return to River Landing this spring, an e-scooter pilot project is in the works for 2023 and a long-awaited downtown grocery store is expected to open in Midtown Plaza.







