


Be a Snow Angel!



From the CBC "640 speeders nabbed in school zones in September" October 21, 2015

"More than 600 drivers received tickets in September for speeding through school zones, according to numbers released by SGI.

Saskatchewan police focused on school zone safety as kids returned to the classroom last month. A total 640 speeding tickets were issued by police, another 32 were given to drivers for having children under 16 who were not wearing seatbelts or were not properly restrained."

Sidewalk Snow Clearing

During the winter months, snow and ice on sidewalks can seriously impair the ability of people to get around safely - especially the elderly and those with mobility restrictions. For that reason, the City of Saskatoon has a bylaw in place requiring owners or occupants of property to clear sidewalks of snow and ice to prevent injury or inconvenience to pedestrians.

The Sidewalk Clearing Bylaw, 2005 (No. 8463) requires that residential sidewalks must be clear of snow and ice within 24 hours of a snowfall. The areas to which this Bylaw applies are outlined on maps in Schedule A (starting on page 8) of the Sidewalk Clearing Bylaw, 2005 (No. 8463).

Saying Goodbye to Pic-a-Flick Video





On November 30th, Pic-a-Flick Video store, a Brevoort Park institution for over 20 years, closed its doors. Shawn Zezula, owner since 1993, said that the decision to close was difficult. In fact, he has been considering it for over two years.

Major Saskatoon news outlets wanted to interview Shawn about the closure of one of the last video rental stores in the city, but true to his connections and loyalty to the Brevoort Park community, he said "no," instead giving the exclusive story to the BPCA newsletter!

Shawn is known for a few things: his love of drag racing, his extensive VHS rental collection, and his unhesitating support of community functions and events.

Most of all, though, Shawn is known for connecting with the community's young people. Shawn shared many examples of his store being used as a warm safe-haven for youth. Kids who were lonely, bored, just wanting to hang out found Shawn's store a laid-back place to hang out and have conversations or watch a movie. Shawn considers particular youngsters from Brevoort Park as family, and some of his best friendships have emerged from his time here. Two young Brevoort Park students were regulars at Shawn's store from grade 6 on, eventually were employed by him, went on to complete university, and are now married with two children. Shawn was the emcee at their wedding, and remains good friends with them.

Outside of Brevoort Park and Pic-a-Flick, Shawn works at Saskatoon International Roadway (SIR), where he has been Track Manager for sixteen years. He owns two dragsters. If you want to reconnect with Shawn outside of the neighbourhood, you will be able to find him at SIR. You might want to ask for "Skippy," though, which is the nickname people know him by outside of Brevoort Park.

We thought it would be most appropriate to end the interview by asking: what are your favourite movies? Without hesitation, Shawn recommended:



Huge Soft Ginger Cookies

Ingredients

- •3/4 cup butter, softened
- •1 cup sugar
- •1 egg
- •1/4 cup molasses
- •2-1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- •1 teaspoon baking soda
- •3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- •1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- •2 teaspoons ground ginger
- •1/4 teaspoon salt
- Additional sugar
- •Option replace spices with Chinese Five Spice-YUM

Directions

- 1. In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in egg and molasses. Combine the flour, ginger, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves and salt; gradually add to the creamed mixture and mix well.
- 2. Roll into 1-1/2-in. balls, then roll in sugar. Place 2 in. apart on ungreased baking sheets. Bake at 350° for 10-12 minutes or until puffy and lightly browned. Remove to wire racks to cool. Yield: 2-1/2 dozen.

CONFUSION AND HEARING LOSS
