INDOOR PROGRAMMING IS BACK

WE CAN'T WAIT TO SEE YOU!

Indoor programming will be returning in October and running to mid-December. Precautions will be in place to ensure safe play for all of our participants.

1. Registration online is highly encouraged. In person registration will be held on September 9th, following the AGM. Social distancing and mask use will be expected at this time.
2. Any shared equipment or surfaces will be disinfected by the instructors before and after classes.
3. Registration will be limited to allow space between participants. Please adhere to this during your programming session and follow direction from your instructor.
4. You will be required to wash or sanitize your hands before and after program.
5. Masks are strongly recommended at this time and may be mandatory for some classes.
6. When you are waiting for your class to begin, do not group and practice social distancing. Do not rush into the room and allow anyone exiting to do so safely. Wearing a mask while waiting is recommended.
7. Only participants registered will be allowed in the room. Parents must wait outside with other siblings and no guests/bring a friend. For classes with more than one time slot, registrants must only attend at their assigned time. This is not flexible and instructors will be enforcing this.
8. If you are coughing, fevered, have a sore throat, are experiencing headaches, body pains, or any other symptoms of illness *do not attend program*. If you have recently traveled or have been in a large gathering, we respectfully ask you not attend program that week. Refunds due to illness will not be issued.

Other info:

- If our space is cancelled, all classes will move to online instruction (such as Zoom) and no refunds will be issued. The only exception to this is pickleball. Pickleball refunds will be pro-rated.
- Some classes will not run as many days as typical and enrollment cost will reflect this.

New BPCA Garage Needs Replacing

Brevoort Park Community Association's garage in the park (next to the rink) houses rink equipment and sports and event supplies when not in use. We also store items for the Brevoort Park School when requested.

As a project to further enhance the park as a place for the community to gather and play, we plan to replace this building. Initially we had planned upgrades, but the current state of the building has forced us to rethink that decision.



Additionally, the Saskatoon Public School board has made changes to rental agreement, and we are no longer able have food in their buildings. This makes it difficult for us to maintain our level of community

offerings and events, all which support our revenue stream. **We anticipate a new building will have multiple usages going forward.**

Plans are in the works with artist Jordoh (Jordan Ernst) of Graffiti Salad (<http://graffitisalad.com>) a former resident of Brevoort Park and student Brevoort Park School to create a mural for the exterior depicting - the park, the two schools in our park, and our the two high Schools - Walter Murray and Holy Cross. Interestingly, having artwork on the building is shown to reduce vandalism and in conjunction with anti-graffiti coating will preserve the curb appeal of the building.

To bring this proposal into action, we need to raise \$50,000. We are looking for corporate sponsors (large and small), applying for grants and working on a fundraising program as well as a Membership drive to support this endeavour.

I'm excited that your neighbourhood is now part of Ward 6 and I would be honoured to represent you at city hall over the next four years.

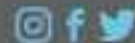

BPCA Community Food Programs

Seeking Donations for Ongoing Support



For many families, food security has deteriorated throughout the Covid-19 pandemic. Experts are warning that the situation is likely to get worse by the fall.

According to Statistics Canada survey done in May, almost one in seven (14.6 percent) Canadians indicated that they lived in a household where food insecurity was a problem which is up from 10.5 percent just two years ago.

Throughout the COVID-19 crisis, the Brevoort Park Community Association (BPCA) has responded by creating community support programs to help those in need. These programs are known as the BPCA Pantry and Student Family Support.

BPCA Pantry

Recognizing that some members of our community do not have access to government support, the BPCA launched the BPCA Pantry. Funds collected through this program are used to purchase non-perishable food items. These items are then delivered to community members that have applied for help through our website:

Donations provide ongoing support to vulnerable community members, including families and seniors who do not qualify or have access to other assistance. As the pandemic continues, the need for support throughout the community continues to grow.

Student Family Support

Programs such as CHEP Good Food Inc. provide ongoing food support to students and their families throughout the school year through breakfast and lunch programs. With the abrupt stop in schooling, many families were left without access to this vital support.

The BPCA reached out to local schools to identify families in need. Together, we formed a plan to bridge these families through the pandemic by re-routing unused community funding. Many neighbours and board members also provided their support through donations.

How To Donate

Due to the ongoing demand for BPCA Pantry and the Student Family Support programs, the BPCA is asking community members and companies for donations. All funds will be used to purchase food staples for community members in need through these trying times. We offer a few options for donating funds.
