NEIGHBORHOOD SAFETY

Urban wildlife is a part of our established neighborhood. Children and adults alike enjoy seeing the hares change colours with the season and romp in the park. With the rabbits come predators. It is not uncommon to see coyotes or foxes in the park. If you cross paths with one of these animals:

1. Do not run or turn your back. Be as loud and big as possible.
2. Wave your arms and throw objects if possible.
3. Keep pets on a short leash and your children close.
4. Use caution dusk through dawn and avoid wooded areas.

LOCAL RINK IS A FAMILY AFFAIR

The BPCA would like to acknowledge the Johnson family, long term community volunteers. When asked about their involvement with the community rink, Greg said:

“A community park rink is to provide something for kids and adults to do and the Brevoort Park rink has been doing that for my family for decades. I spent many hours on the rink as a teenager new to the city and now my own kids have been enjoying this rink, too. My two boys, Blaine and Davin, went to Brevoort Park School and skated with Kyle Allin’s boy, Blake, on this rink. Kyle, Todd Young, and I would use a garden tractor with a snow blower on it to clean the ice for the kids and then flood it with a hose. A couple of other parents from the neighborhood would help out. Kyle thought it would be great to have a Zamboni instead of the snowblower to make our life easier. So, a few years ago he told me where one was. We checked it out and I talked to Darren Schroh and Darren donated one to the community association. I arranged a tow truck to haul it over to Jarrett Fraser’s garage. It wasn’t running so between Jarrett, Nelson Fraser, Kyle and myself, we sourced parts and got it running. We had to cut a gate into the rink to get the Zamboni to fit the rink. A year later I arranged to get puck board and with seventeen community parents and six kids helping, we rounded the rink and put up puck board. Now, Mark Mowles, Jay Smith, my two boys, Blaine and Davin, and I, maintain the rink and keep the Zamboni running. We keep things going even when we aren’t the ones skating. There’s been many evenings when my boys and I go over to check the ice conditions or get a call to come out to help clean and flood the ice which can take 3-4 hours a night. Actually, it’s been over a dozen years that my boys and I have joined with other community members to keep the rink going. The Christmas Eve Cup held every December 23, is one of the biggest events that we prepare the rink surface for.”

If you see Greg and the crew out working on the rink, please thank them for their time and commitment to our wonderful rink.

City Councillors sit on a number of boards and committees. A few of my responsibilities include: Chair of the Standing Policy Committee on Finance, member of the Standing Policy Committee on Planning and Community Services and I am Council's strategic lead for downtown development.

City hall highlights:

Property owners received assessment notices, as is done every four years. Learn more: saskatoon.ca/assessment In light of the challenges during the pandemic, Council readjusted the budget to lower the tax increase to 2.83 per cent.

The spring construction season will be getting underway soon, and a number of projects are planned for our ward. Find out more: saskatoon.ca/construction We are making progress on basic infrastructure improvements in our historic neighbourhoods, and The Building Better Roads program is starting to reflect a better maintained city. Council has also directed investments into sidewalks for 2021.

With Saskatoon's Growth Plan, multi-residential development applications are coming forward in and around the core. Building density in the heart of the city is designed to improve efficiency and land use, reduce urban sprawl and support a modern public transportation system. While infill growth is necessary, it is important multi-residential projects are done respectfully and in consideration of both adjacent properties and the overall neighbourhood.
