- **Community Advocacy.** The community association is operated by a team of volunteers invested in making Brevoort Park the best neighborhood to live in. This includes advocating , and sometimes funding, community upgrades (accessible side-walk ramps).

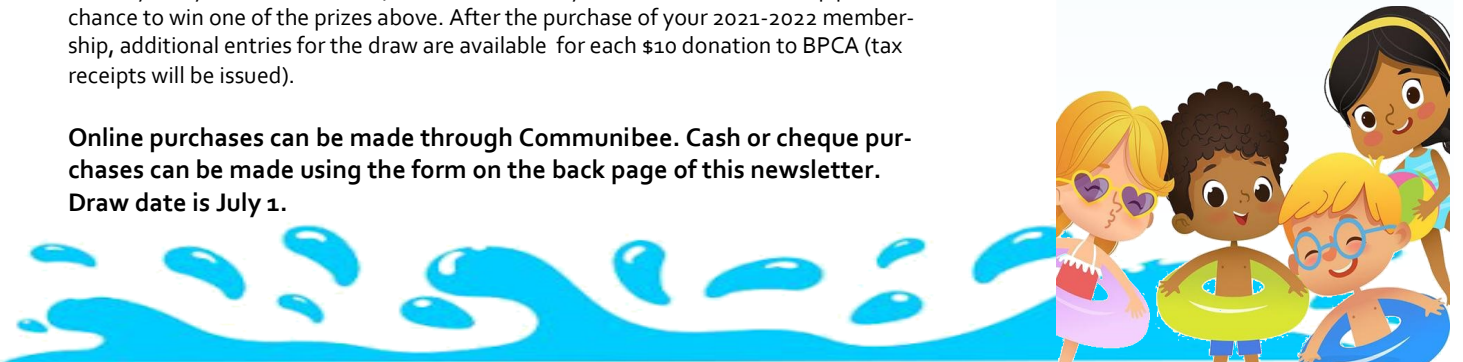

Backyard Birding in Brevoort

Living in these crazy pandemic times has necessitated a shift in family activities. As we try to limit our contact with other people, folks are getting creative and resourceful in finding diversions which fit within the confines of public health protocols. One result of this is an uptick in backyard birding. In Brevoort Park we are well situated for this activity due to the abundance of mature trees. Birding is made even easier by having one of Saskatchewan's best selections of birding accoutrements and expertise found at a neighbourhood treasure, the Wild Birds Unlimited store in the mall at 2600 8th Street. The helpful folks there can help you to get started, if this is a pursuit which interests you, and if you're already an aficionado, they have the knowledge and supplies to help you take things to the next level. (In case you're wondering, I have no connection with this store other than being a satisfied customer!). Another resource which I thoroughly enjoy is the Sask Birders page on Facebook. There are plenty of beautiful pictures shared, questions asked and answers given in this community of birders, ranging from complete newbies to life-long enthusiasts and experts. There are plenty of apps to help you identify birds as well, or if you're a Luddite like me, you may prefer to find a book on Saskatchewan or Canadian birds at McNally's.

Of course you don't have to know all about the birds in order to enjoy watching them. So, how does one encourage our feathered friends to visit? The two main things that will bring birds to your yard are clean, safe sources of food and water. Feeders and bird baths need to be cleaned regularly when

refilling, to prevent disease. The most popular, affordable food that will tempt a variety of birds is black-oil sunflower seeds. You can get them shelled, which seems to be pricier, but you won't be paying for the weight and volume of the shells, so in the end there is probably not much difference, and they create much less mess! It's a dry year, so water sources are a big draw. When setting up, please put your feeders or water in places which will not make the birds easy prey for cats. They are the leading cause of the declining songbird numbers in North America. Window strikes are second, so please put feeders away from your windows, especially if they can see through to windows on the opposite side of your house.

Saskatchewan is on a major migration route. In the spring and fall you may see different species on a weekly basis, while some -like the charming chickadees- are here year round. If you decide to give this a try, be patient. It may take the birds a while to find what you've set out for them, but be forewarned - once you get started, you may find that you're hooked! My first feeder has been joined by a number of others, and some bird houses as well. I'm not sorry though - they are a delight to watch!

Lisa Lambert—MLA Update

We are leading all Canadian provinces in vaccine doses administered per 100,000 of the population. If we are going to keep up this pace, we need the federal government to procure more vaccines ASAP. Thank you for being patient and for observing public health orders to keep our friends, families, and communities safe

Countries further along than Canada in their vaccination rollout are seeing significant reductions in both their case numbers and hospitalization numbers, and I am confident we will see the same results here. Thank you to all staff working at clinics across the province. Every shot in every arm makes Saskatchewan safer. The vaccines work, the vaccines are safe, and when it's your turn, I strongly encourage you to roll up your sleeve and stick it to COVID. Saskatchewan is leading Canada's economic recovery from COVID-19, something that is reflected in a remarkable 25 per cent increase in wholesale trade growth. Strong wholesale trade numbers, a leading economic indicator, coupled with the best vaccine rollout plan in the country, shows our province will see a quicker economic recovery than other jurisdictions.

With the added increase in COVID-19 variants and online

learning, SaskTel is waiving data overage charges from April 12 to June 30, 2021, to further assist individuals with their online learning as well as those who are working remotely due to the pandemic. SGI customers will be receiving rebate cheques in May for approximately \$285 per vehicle. SaskPower customers are also currently enjoying a 10 per cent bill reduction which will equate to an average \$131 per customer this year. Saskatchewan residents have the lowest utility expenses in all of Canada during one of the most challenging times in history. As the spring sitting of the legislature continues, the 2021-22 provincial budget protects the health and safety of our people and our economy, builds our province through investments in infrastructure to stimulate economic activity, grows Saskatchewan through various incentives and key investments, and delivers on 14 specific campaign commitments to make life more affordable.
